






Medicare Advantage Can Grow Your Practice

Each day 10,000 people in the U.S. turn 65.1 The population of adults 65 years of age and older is growing and will likely be a larger part of your dental practice in the years ahead.

Medicare Advantage is administered by private insurance companies and offers extra benefits that Original Medicare doesn't cover, such as dental services. Medicare by the numbers

- Nearly 5 million Florida residents are eligible for Medicare.²
- Over 52% of those eligible are enrolled in Medicare Advantage plans.²
- Nationally, 74% of Medicare Advantage members are enrolled in plans that include dental benefits.³
- Average out-of-pocket dental care costs for Medicare members in the U.S. was \$874 in 2018.⁴
